## Recommendations

Based on the findings of this study, the following recommendations have been proffered.

i Guided Discovery method should be used in teaching mathematics in our Secondary Schools especially in Senior Secondary schools.

ii Seminars and workshops should be organized for practicing teachers on the use of Guided Discovery method of teaching by the government and relevant agencies.

iii Curriculum developers should adopt this guided discovery strategy perspective in restructuring mathematics curriculum in Nigeria.
