- 2. Christ-like life
- 3. Openness and impartiality
- 4. Life of love as Christ did
- 5. Life of steadfastness in moral convictions

#### The "be-atitudes"

- 1. as the background for authentic Christianity
- 2. as an encouragement against taunts
- 3. the two metaphors:

Salt → light

## Salt (Sodium chloride → NaCL)

Used as


- 1. Preservative
- 2. flavour enhancement
- 3. Disinfectant
- 4. in cosmetics

Avoid abuse (dont put too much of it in food or rub it in wounds)

#### Light

speed of 299.792.458 metre per second (m/s)

- 1. Dispels darkness
- 2. brings warmth
- 3. points the way
- 4. serves as a warning





#### Love as Christ loved

God is love (Deus Caritas Est)

#### Love is:

- 1. The core of our Christian faith/belief
- 2. A word widely used and abused

#### Supplement(s) of the injunction to love:

- 1. John 13: 34 -35 (love one another as I loved you)
- 2. Mtt 22:39 (love your neighbour as yourself)

- St. Theresa of the Child Jesus
- St. Mother Theresa
- St. Francis of Assisi
- St. Maximillian Kolbe

# Loving as Christ did entails - non negligence of ONE OF THESE (Matt 25:45)

Who are they? (one of these)?

Isaiah and Mathew (resumé of the answer)
"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I
was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a
stranger and you made me welcome, lacking
clothes and you clothed me, sick and you
visited me, in prison and you came to see
me" (Mathew 25:35 - 36)

"Is not this the type of fasting that pleases me: to break unjust fetters, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break all yokes? Is it not sharing your food with the hungry, and sheltering the homeless poor; if you see someone lacking clothes, to clothe him.... Then your light will blaze out like the dawn." (Isaiah 58: 6 - 8).

"As we aspire to or live an authentic Christian live, our entire life should revolve around Christ. Any deviation from this reality means a movement away from the call to perfection and a negation of our Christian vocation. Such would, thereby, establish inauthentic Christianity."
